



## 4. Diverse Types of Articles Published in 2017




In 2017, JLPM has published 98 articles, among which there are 59 Editorials, 12 Original Articles and 8 Review Articles.

#### 5. International Diversity of Corresponding Authors in 2017




Corresponding authors of 98 articles published in 2017 come from 21 countries/regions, 22% of them from Italy, 13% from Mainland China and 12% from the USA.


